1. Newspaper, magazines, household fine paper, catalogues and telephone books

- Includes advertising inserts and glossy flyers
- White, brown or coloured writing and mailed papers
- Photocopy paper and envelopes
- Keep newspaper separate from cardboard
- No carbon or tissue
- Hard covers removed from books

Bag and place beside your Blue Box

2. Corrugated cardboard

- Layered cardboard boxes with a ripple between the layers
- Keep newspaper separate from cardboard

Flatten and bundle (No larger than 30"x30"x8") No wax-coated products

3. Glass bottles and jars only

- Clear and coloured food and beverage containers only

Remove lids and place in garbage. Place loose, to one side in Blue Box

4. Metal food and beverage containers

- Steel and aluminum food and beverage cans
- Aluminum trays and foil
- Steel lids or jar lids can be placed in metal food container

Rinse and remove lids or put into cans. Place loose, to one side in Blue Box

5. Plastic bottles and jars

- Container marked with on the side or bottom: 1(PETE) , 2(HOPE)
- Plastic pop bottles, water bottles, soap, anti-freeze, laundry detergent or Javex bottles
- Plastic lids should be put into garbage
- Containers must have screw top lids (no tubs) eg: margarine, yogurt containers

Place loose in your Blue Box

A PROPER BLUE BOX IS ONE THAT IS SORTED CORRECTLY:

- Glass on one side, separated by paper products with metal container and plastic on the other side
- Cardboard tied and bundled beside the Blue Box
- Newspaper bundled or bagged beside the Blue Box
