NOTICE OF PUBLIC MEETING - ZONING BY-LAW AMENDMENT

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Corporation of the Township of The North Shore will hold a **PUBLIC MEETING** on:

THURSDAY, APRIL 25, 2019 at 6:30 p.m.

in the Council Chambers, Municipal Building
Township of North Shore, 1385 Highway #17, Algoma Mills, ON

TO CONSIDER a proposed amendment to Zoning By-law of the Corporation of the Township of The North Shore pursuant to the provisions of Section 34 of the *Planning Act, R.S.O., 1990*.

Applicant: Darien Aggregates Inc. c/o Province of Ontario (Crown Land)

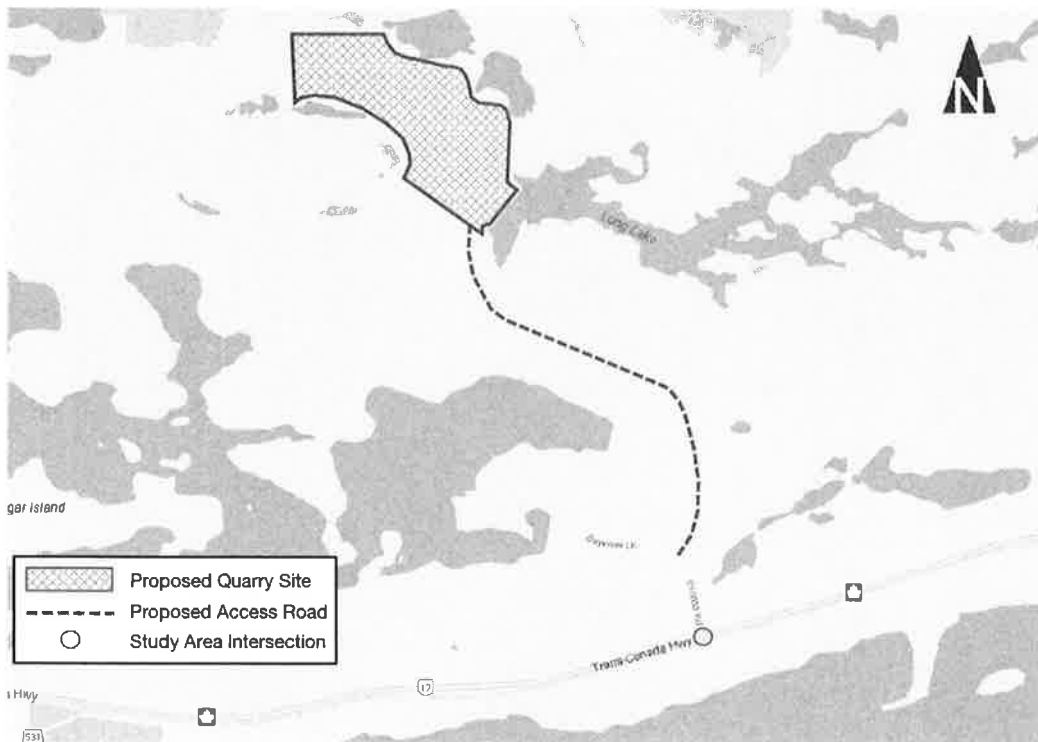
Location: Long Township, Township of The North Shore, District of Algoma – 3.5 km north of Highway 17

West, accessed off Pronto Road.

Proposal: The purpose and effect of this zoning amendment application is to rezone the lands to permit and allow the development of a new Class A – Category 12, below water quarry.

Additional Information: Several technical reports, studies and plans submitted in association with this application are available as noted below. The lands are also subject to an application under the Aggregate Resources Act, to permit a new quarry on a 115.3 hectare parcel (permit area) with an extraction area of approximately 68.3 hectares.

ANY PERSON OR AGENCY may make written submissions to the Township of The North Shore before a decision is made on the file. We would advise **AGENCIES** wishing to make a written submission to do so no later than **April 15, 2019**.

ANY PERSON may attend the public meeting and/or make written or verbal representation either in support of or in opposition to the proposed zoning by-law amendment.

IF YOU WISH TO BE NOTIFIED of the decision of Council on the proposed zoning by-law amendment, you must make a written request to the Clerk-Treasurer of the Township of The North Shore (see address below).

IF A PERSON OR PUBLIC BODY does not make oral submissions at a public meeting or make written submissions to the Township of The North Shore before the by-law is passed the person or public body is not entitled to appeal the decision of the Council of the Township of The North Shore to the Local Planning Appeal Tribunal.

IF A PERSON OR PUBLIC BODY does not make oral submissions at the public meeting or make written submissions to the Township of The North Shore before the proposed zoning by-law is passed, may not be added as a party to the hearing of an appeal before the Local Planning Appeal Tribunal unless, in the opinion of the Tribunal, there are reasonable grounds to do so.

PLEASE NOTE all comments and submissions received will become part of the public record. Comments received as part of the public participation process for this proposal will be considered by Council.

Cannabis Fire Safety

RESPONSIBILITY GROWS HERE.



IMPAIRMENT INCLUDES CANNABIS



Cooking while under the influence of alcohol, prescription drugs or cannabis can result in a fire.

Don't put yourself or your family at risk. Always remain alert when cooking.

Keep a close eye on anyone attempting to cook or smoke while impaired.

SMOKING IS SMOKING



Smoking is the leading cause of residential fire deaths in Ontario.

Encourage smokers to smoke outside. **Never smoke or take in bed.**

Whether it is tobacco or cannabis, cigarettes and joints need to be properly extinguished in large, deep ashtrays.

HAZARDOUS EXTRACTION OF CANNABIS OIL CAN CAUSE EXPLOSIONS AND FIRES



Extracting cannabis oil with flammable solvents is extremely hazardous. It can result in the uncontrolled release of flammable vapours. If ignited, these vapours lead to explosions and fires that can cause serious injury or death.

Hazardous extraction in basements is particularly dangerous because flammable vapours can accumulate in higher concentrations leading to even more powerful explosions.

Hazardous extraction using flammable materials such as butane is against the law in homes and in basements.

TOO MANY WIRES CAN CAUSE FIRES



Extension cords should be used only as a temporary connection. If permanent wiring is required, have additional outlets installed by a licensed electrician. Extension cords should not be linked together. Instead, use an extension cord that is long enough to do the job.

Avoid running cords under rugs, which can damage the cord and cause a fire.

Avoid overloading a circuit with "octopus outlets". If additional outlets or circuits are required, have them installed by a licensed electrician.

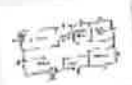
Ensure that all electrical appliances such as grow lamps are certified by an accredited testing agency like ULC or CSA. And make sure they are operated according to manufacturer's instructions.

SMOKE ALARMS SAVE LIVES!



Only working smoke alarms give you the early warning you need to safely escape a fire. Install smoke and carbon monoxide alarms in your home. Test them every month.



Practice a home fire escape plan so everyone in your home knows what to do when the smoke and carbon monoxide alarms sound in an emergency.

Public right to access government information

Generally, information produced or gathered by government offices and agencies is accessible to the public. Government information can be valuable for businesses, reporters, and people involved in lawsuits. Some information is easily accessible, such as current by-laws and minutes, legislation, Commission Reports, or court cases because it is published and distributed in libraries, government book stores, and online. However, some information is not readily available without requesting it, such as internal memos, expenses, and reports on sensitive subject matters.

In Ontario, there are three main laws that regulate requests for information held by a government office:

Municipal: *Municipal Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act (MFIPPA)*

Provincial: *Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act (FIPPA)*

Federal: *Access to Information Act*

Municipal information

Informal request

To request information from your municipal office, you can first make an informal request by calling, writing or visiting the Township office. If it is readily available, current information, copies will be provided for the fee set out in By-law 18-27 "Tariff of Fees". If it is information that will require research time (per the Municipal Clerk's discretion), please see below.

Formal request

If you are not able to obtain the information you are looking for with an informal request, you may submit a *formal* freedom of information request. To make a formal request, you must complete a request for information form. Request forms are available at the Township office. A generic request form is available online from the IPC website. You must then submit the request, along with a small fee (see Tariff of Fee By-law and/or contact the Municipal Clerk), to the Freedom of Information and Privacy Coordinator (Municipal Clerk) at the Township office from which you want to collect the information. When making a request, both formal and informal, you must state the law under which the request is being made: ex: *MFIPPA*. The Coordinator has 30 days to respond to your request.

Appeals to IPC

If your request is denied, you can appeal to the IPC by filling out forms available at the IPC office. Appeals must be made within 30 days of the government's decision. For more information, contact the Ontario Office of the Information and Privacy Commissioner.

**PROPERTY STANDARDS COMMITTEE
SEEKING NEW MEMBERS**

The Township of The North Shore is currently seeking new members for the Property Standards Committee.

The Committee exists to hear appeals from any property owner within the Township who has been issued an Order To Remedy by the Property Standards Officer on his or her property, and to which the property owner disagrees.

The committee meets four times per year for general meetings and again whenever an appeal is filed. Usually there are no more than one or two appeals heard per year, so the time required for this committee is not overwhelming.

Remuneration for meetings and mileage is offered. Members are required to own property within the Township and have the ability to be fair and objective in the decision making process.

The Appeals Committee is an independent body of Council and staff and its rulings are based on the merits of the complaint and appeal evidence. The Committee has the same powers as the Property Standards Officer; in so much as they have the authority to either confirm the Order as it was written by the Officer; rescind the Order entirely; extend the timeline given to carry out the particulars of the Order; as well modifying the Order in whatever manner the Committee decides upon.

The Appeals Committee fills a very important role for the Township. Without an Appeals Committee; there can be no Property Standards By-Law enforcement.
