# **Council Report**

SUBJECT: Budget and Tax Ratios

# **RECOMMENDATIONS:**

That Council receive the report from the Treasurer.

# Information

As directed by Council, the Budget By-Law and the Tax Rate By-Law have been prepared and are included on the Agenda for this meeting.

## Tax Rate

While the dollar value of the levy increased by 3% to a total of \$1,203,530, due to assessment increases/change in type of assessment, this translates to a 2.02% increase in the municipal tax rate. When the municipal and education rates are considered in total, the average increase from 2024 is 1.83%.

# Tax Ratios

There is a new tax class this year, Aggregate Extractive. While, initially, OPTA had the associated tax ratio for this class set at 0.895077, in keeping with the established range of fairness and maintaining the tax ratio philosophy used for other tax classes, a tax ratio of 1.1 has been used for this tax class. The tax rates have been calculated using this ratio.

# Tax by Ward

A new feature of OPTA is comparison by Ward. The following chart was created using information extracted from OPTA.

### Information

As Council is aware, 2026 is the next municipal election year.

Presently, Council is elected as follows:

- A Mayor elected by all electors in the municipality;
- A "Councillor At Large" elected by all electors in the municipality; and
- One Councillor for each of our three wards, elected by those electors eligible to vote in the ward.

While Staff is not recommending any change to this, should any Member of Council wish to discuss changes to how Council is elected, now is the time for this discussion to start. This is due to the requirement that any changes made to the composition of Council (size or how elected) are to be finalized prior to December 31<sup>st</sup> of the year preceding the election.

If Council wishes to discuss this matter further, directing Staff to bring a report concerning possible changes for Council's consideration would be most appropriate.

<u>SUBJECT:</u> TENDER RESULTS – Pronto Water Treatment Plant UV System Replacement

**RECOMMENDATION:** That Council receive the staff report and Quotation Report from PUC for consideration, and that Council accept the Tender from R. F. Contracting Inc. in the amount of \$104,900.00 plus applicable HST for the Pronto Water Treatment Plant UV System Replacement.

The Tender for the Pronto Water Treatment Plant UV System Upgrade was advertised and issued on April 24th, 2025, per the Township of The North Shore's Procurement Policy, with a deadline to submit a sealed tenders by Thursday, April 8th, 2025, at 2 PM.

Two (2) Tenders were received (amounts exclude HST):

- R. F. Contracting Inc. \$ 104,900.00
- S&T Electrical Contractors Ltd. \$ 186,120.00

All required documentation from both companies has been received (including Insurance and WSIB coverages) and all documentation is in compliance with the Township of The North Shore Procurement Policy.

The tenders were reviewed by PUC, who have recommended to Council that the project be awarded to R. F. Contracting Inc.

Per the Project Schedule, as listed within the tender document in Article 4.1, the Contractor shall commence work within 10 days of notification of Award of Contract, with the work performed no later than August 29, 2025.

Quotation Report – Pronto Water Treatment Plant UV System Replacement

#### INTRODUCTION:

We have reviewed the quotation submissions received by the Municipal Clerk at the Township of the North Shore (the Township) office for the above noted project. The following is a summary of the tendering process, our review of the quotations received, and our recommendation for award for the Township's consideration.

## **PROJECT DESCRIPTION:**

The work generally consists of removing the existing ultraviolet (UV) disinfection system, consisting of six (6) UV reactors, associated piping and appurtenances, and replacing it with a new SCG Process UV treatment system. The work was presented in the Request for Quotation (RFQ) Document as follows:

- 1. General requirements.
- 2. Performance security.
- 3. Mobilize and demobilize to and from the site.
- 4. Decommission the existing UV treatment system.
- 5. Provide SCG Process UV treatment system.
- 6. Electrical and control work.
- 7. Restoration.

The RFQ Document was prepared in accordance with the Township's Procurement Policy.

#### SUMMARY OF QUOTATIONS:

S&T, McLeod, R.F. Contracting, and Jeremy's Plumbing responded, requesting an RFQ package. RFQ packages were issued to these contractors on April 24, 2025.

One (1) addendum was issued to clarify inquiries from bidders.

Two (2) quotations were received at the Township office before the closing deadline of 2:00 pm Thursday, May 8, 2025. The quotations were opened publicly at 2:10 pm on the same day at the Township office.

Quotation deposits were checked, collected, and are held for return to the bidders at a later date. The following is a summary of the quotation results in ascending order of Total Quotation Price (excluding HST).

1. R.F. Contracting	\$104,900.00
2. S&T Electrical Contractors	\$186,120.00

Following the public opening, the quotation submissions were forwarded to PUC Services Inc. (PUC) for a detailed review.

Copies of the submissions are enclosed with this Quotation Report.

#### **REVIEW OF QUOTATIONS**

We have reviewed the quotations in detail with respect to the requirements set out in the RFQ Document. The following are specific comments from our review:

- 1. The quotations received were properly executed with the bidder's signature and witnessed.
- 2. The quotations were reviewed for mathematical errors. None were found.
- 3. Bidders were required to submit an Agreement to Bond certifying they are able to obtain the required Performance and Labour and Material Payment Bonds. All bidders complied.
- 4. Bidders were required to provide proof of general and liability insurance in the minimum amount of \$5 million, and include the Township, PUC Services Inc, and the Engineer as insured parties. S&T provided proof of insurance with their submission, while R.F. Contracting provided a copy upon request.

- 5. Bidders were required to provide an up-to-date copy of their WSIB Clearance Certificate. All bidders complied.
- 6. Bidders were required to acknowledge receipt of all addenda issued. All bidders complied.

From our review of the quotation submissions, all were in general conformance with the RFQ Document, except as noted in item 4 above.

#### **RECOMMENDATION:**

Based on our review of the quotations, it is noted that R.F. Contracting Inc. submitted the low bid. R.F. Contracting Inc. has significant experience with water treatment plant construction and upgrades, and we believe their pricing is reasonable for the proposed scope of work. They have recently completed similar work for PUC and have performed well from both a quality and health and safety perspective.

It is recommended that the Township accepts the quotation submitted by R.F. Contracting Inc. in the amount of \$104,900.00 (excluding HST).

Upon receipt of the Township's direction to proceed, we will inform the successful bidder and prepare the Contract Documents for signature.



- 1. **DEFINITIONS:** The following defined terms mean:
- "Company" means Smith Cameron Pump Solutions Inc., d.b.a. SCG Process.
- "Purchaser" means party named on the order confirmation as the purchaser of the Goods or Services.







### 2.2 PRODUCT REQUIREMENTS

### 2.21 General

- 2.211 The UV equipment shall be installed indoors, in a dry location.
- 2.212 The UV equipment shall operate in an enclosed reactor and use high output amalgam UV lamps.
- 2.213 Draining of the UV equipment shall not be required to change UV lamps or to perform calibration checks on the UV intensity sensors.
- 2.214 All wetted materials exposed to UV light shall be 316 stainless steel, quartz equivalent to GE Type 214, FKM, or other suitable UV resistant material.
- 2.215 The electrical system shall be designed to provide maximum reliability of the UV equipment.
- 2.216 All heat sensitive components shall be adequately cooled with forced dry air.
- 2.217 The UV equipment shall be equipped with safety devices to prevent over temperature conditions should any cooling device fails.
- 2.218 The UV equipment shall be designed to allow operators to perform routine maintenance such as lamp replacement, without the use of special tools.
- 2.219 The UV equipment shall be equipped with a safety interlock to prevent accidental exposure to UV light in the event the system is not powered down during lamp replacement.

#### 2.22 UV Lamps

- 2.221 The UV Lamp shall be rated for minimum useful life of 12,000 hours.
- 2.222 The UV Lamp shall be able to be cycled up to 12 times within a 24 hour period.
- 2.223 The UV Lamp shall use high purity quartz such as GE type 219 or equivalent with coating to ensure constant UV output over complete lamp lifetime.
- 2.224 The UV Lamp shall use bases of ceramic construction, resistant to UV light with electrical connection at one end only.
- 2.225 The UV Lamp filament shall be rugged to withstand shock and vibration.
- 2.226 The UV Lamp shall have monochromatic spectral output with the emissions peaking at 253.7nm and shall be non-ozone producing.



2.263 The purge valve shall discharge water from the UV reactor if low UVT water is detected within the UV chamber.

#### 2.27 Electrical Enclosure

- 2.271 The UV equipment shall be powered and controlled by one electrical enclosure.
- 2.272 The electrical enclosure shall be mounted to the UV reactor and contain the microcontroller, electronic ballasts, and power distribution devices.
- 2.273 A power supply of 120Vac, single phase, two wire plus a ground, 60Hz, shall be provided in a ground-fault circuit-interrupter (GFCI) receptacle by others in the vicinity of the UV equipment.
- 2.274 The electrical enclosure shall be powered by a detachable power cord.

### 2.28 Electronic Ballasts

- 2.281 Each ballast shall drive one UV lamp.
- 2.282 Ballasts shall incorporate a filament pre-heat circuit to improve reliability of lamp startup and allow for multiple on/off lamp cycles per day.
- 2.283 Ballasts shall be installed with polarized connectors for ease of maintenance.
- 2.284 Operating power factor for the ballasts shall be 0.98 or higher.

### 2.29 Instrumentation and Controls

- 2.291 The control system shall continuously monitor and control the UV equipment's functions.
- 2.292 Complete control and monitoring of the UV equipment shall be accomplished through the operator interface.
- 2.293 The operator interface shall be a color touchscreen and display the following information: UV system status, UV Dose, UV Intensity, UVT prediction, UV lamp lifetime, maximum prescribed flow rate, countdown for warm up and power down, UV Lamp cycles, power cycles, cycle time of automatic quartz cleaning device, unit temperatures including water, pcb, lamp and overall system.
- 2.294 The control system shall provide warnings and alarms for all critical devices and functions in both visual and audible format.
- 2.295 The control system shall contain a real time clock.
- 2.296 The control system shall maintain a log of the last 100 events and record the time of the event and all critical parameters.
- 2.297 The control system shall provide discrete outputs in the form of dry contacts for warning and alarm conditions for remote monitoring.
- 2.298 The control system shall allow remote operation of the UV lamps with the UV reactor on standby when not in use.
- 2.299 The control system shall be able to provide analog outputs for UV Dose, or UV Intensity, or predicted UVT, and Modbus connectivity.
- 2.2910 The control system shall be able to provide continuous data logging every 30 seconds onto a USB drive.
- 2.2911 The control system shall be able to connect to and control a solenoid valve for automatic shutdown of untreated water.

### 2.30 Safety Warnings and Alarms

- 2.301 The control system shall provide the following warnings at a minimum:
  - i) End of lamp life approaching
  - ii) End of lamp life exceeded






### 1. Bidder Questions

### **Council Report**

<u>SUBJECT:</u> Resolution of Support – Opposition of Bill 5: Protecting Ontario by Unleashing Our Economy Act, 2025

**RECOMMENDATION:** That Council show support in the form of a Resolution of Support regarding opposition of Bill 5: Protecting Ontario by Unleashing Our Economy Act, 2025.

Please find attached to this report the full proposed Resolution of Support from the Township of The North Shore regarding opposition to Bill 5: Protecting Ontario by Unleashing Our Economy Act, 2025 for Council's review and consideration in supporting, as well as the "Overview of Ontario's Bill 5 A Snapshot of the Bill's Most Egregious Provisions" document by environmental defence.

Whereas the Government of Ontario has introduced *Bill 5: Protecting Ontario by Unleashing Our Economy Act, 2025*, which proposes substantial changes to environmental planning policies, including replacing the **Endangered Species Act** with a new framework that reduces protections for at-risk species, and enabling the creation of **Special Economic Zones** that may override local planning authority and environmental oversight;

**And whereas** the Township of The North Shore supports increasing housing supply and economic growth, but believes this must be done in a way that upholds environmental responsibility and maintains the integrity of local planning processes;

**And whereas** Bill 5, as proposed, risks weakening safeguards for natural heritage systems, threatening biodiversity, and diminishing the authority of Municipalities to manage growth in accordance with local needs and official plans;

**Therefore be it Resolved** that Council for the Corporation of the Township of The North Shore:

- 1. **Opposes** the provisions in Bill 5 that reduce environmental protections or override municipal planning authority;
- 2. **Urges** the Province of Ontario to support housing and infrastructure development in ways that align with sound environmental planning and empower municipalities with appropriate planning tools;
- 3. **Directs** that a copy of this resolution be sent to:
  - o The Honourable Rob Flack, Minister of Municipal Affairs and Housing;
  - The Honourable Todd J. McCarthy, Minister of the Environment, Conservation and Parks;
  - o The Honourable **Doug Ford**, Premier of Ontario;
  - The Association of Municipalities of Ontario (AMO);
  - o All Ontario municipalities.

## Overview of Ontario's Bill 5

A Snapshot of the Bill's Most Egregious Provisions BACKGROUNDER May 2025



Bill 5, the *Protect Ontario by Unleashing Our Economy Act*, would give Premier Ford and his Cabinet unprecedented power over our communities, including powers to dictate who is exempt from the law and who is not.

If passed, Bill 5 would be a direct attack on healthy communities, good planning, clean water and air, species at risk and the rights of Indigenous people—all to benefit a handful of the government's hand picked friends.

### A Snapshot of Bill 5

### Special Economic Zones (Schedule 9)

Schedule 9 in Bill 5 introduces so-called "Special Economic Zones" to be designated by the provincial Cabinet, within which "trusted proponents" will be exempted from provincial laws and regulations including municipal laws and bylaws (e.g. the Planning Act, Environmental Protection Act, Occupational Health and Safety Act, Highway Traffic Act, Trespass to Property Act).

What are the implications?

- The establishment of Special Economic Zones creates a legal mechanism to bypass
  consultation and engagement with First Nation governments by the government and the
  development proponent. The exemption from provincial laws and regulations could
  represent a breach of constitutionally defined and protected Indigenous rights including the
  Duty to Consult and the respecting the Honour of the Crown under section 35. It also
  represents an abandonment of public participation as legislated under the Environmental Bill
  of Rights, 1993.
- While long-established consultation and engagement rights are being upended, this legislation does not propose any replacement or substitutes. As a result, Indigenous critics of the Special Economic Zones have deemed them "Constitution-free Zones."
- Details and criteria for critical definitions by which a "designated project" by a "trusted proponent" could be assigned under a Special Economic Zone have yet to be developed or revealed to the public. Since the regulations for Special Economic Zones are still forthcoming, it is conceivable that the Ontario Cabinet could make unilateral decisions using open-ended definitions that will create significant uncertainty for both Indigenous and non-Indigenous communities faced with mega-projects that will serve the interests of the Premier's inner circle.

### The Ontario Heritage Act (Schedule 7)

Schedule 7 of the Bill proposes to exempt developments from archeological assessments if the Ontario government is of the opinion that an exemption "could potentially advance one or more of the following provincial priorities":

- Transit
- Housing
- Health and Long-Term Care
- Other Infrastructure; and
- Such Other Priorities as May Be Prescribed.

### What are the implications?

- By exempting infrastructure and housing projects from archeological assessments the Ontario government will be backtracking on Indigenous reconciliation progress made since the Oka crisis of 1990 as well as the 2006 standoff in Caledonia in 2006.
- Archeological (and environmental) assessments often trigger the duty to consult with Indigenous communities and First Nations governments. Undertaking archeological assessments processes is also one of the ways that governments uphold the Honour of the Crown. Destroying undisturbed Indigenous historic sites in the name of economic progress would set Ontario back decades in Indigenous and economic reconciliation.

## Replacement of the *Endangered Species Act* with the *Species Conservation Act* (Schedule 10)

Schedule 10 of the Bill proposes to repeal the *Endangered Species Act, 2007* and replace it with a new *Species Conservation Act*. The vast and sweeping proposed changes will move Ontario away from a science-based approach to protecting species at risk to one that relies on industry and developers' voluntary and discretionary approaches. The proposed changes also remove protection for habitat and eliminate the requirements for recovery strategies for at-risk species.

Significant amendments that will politicize the protection of species at risk include:

- The removal of the mandatory listing of species at risk for the Minister to list species identified by an independent committee of experts (the Committee on the Status of Species at Risk Ontario or COSSARO).
- Narrowing the definition of "habitat" so that the definition excludes a species' habitat for
  "feeding" or "migration." This will lead to the fragmentation of critical habitat for species at
  risk, thereby accelerating their disappearance. The bill also suggests that the Premier's
  Cabinet can further limit the definition of habitat by regulation (i.e. without having to vote
  on it in the Legislature).
- Removing the requirement for the government to develop a recovery strategy, management
  plans, response statements or a species' review of progress. By no longer tracking species
  at risk and removing the requirement for recovery strategies, the Ontario government is
  effectively removing the onus to ensure conservation programs and initiatives result in
  species' recovery.

- Removing the prohibition on the harassment of species thereby removing the prohibition on disturbing a species in a way that could disrupt a species' behaviour or life processes.
- Introducing a new approach that relies entirely on a voluntary "registry" whose use will be at the discretion of industry, as there does not appear to be provisions authorizing mandatory criteria for registration, nor mitigation measures to minimize the harm caused to the species at risk.
- Permitting also becomes completely discretionary—at the behest and whim of the Minister of Environment, Conservation and Parks.

### What are the implications?

- By removing the focus on the species' recovery strategies and programming, the Ontario government is rejecting scientifically sound and globally agreed-to international protection approaches and targets for biodiversity conservation.
- By no longer tracking species at risk and removing the requirement for recovery strategies, the Ontario government is effectively removing the onus to ensure conservation programs and initiatives result in species' recovery.
- Currently industry must receive permits to undertake activities that will kill/harm species at risk, whereas in the future they simply have to register their intent to kill/harm species.
- Bill 5 represents a sweeping and unprecedented gutting of the Endangered Species Act. By
  eliminating the Act and substituting toothless legislation that relies on voluntary and
  discretionary measures by major extractive industries and developers, Ontario will
  accelerate the extirpation and extinction of key species at risk.

### Exemptions Under the *Environmental Assessment Act* (Schedule 3)

Bill 5 proposes to terminate comprehensive Environmental Assessments for two projects: 1) the proposed Eagle's Nest mine as part of the proposed Ring of Fire in Northern Ontario and 2) the proposed Dresden Dump.

The Environmental Assessments for both projects were put into place to provide forward-looking understanding of environmental and socio-economic conditions and impacts of planned developments to government decision-makers, Indigenous communities as well as members of the public.

#### What are the implications?

• The unilateral termination of the EAs for both the Eagle's Nest mine and the Dresden landfill will rob the public, Indigenous communities and right-holders, the industry proponents as well as government officials of comprehensive scientific information for sound decision-making on these potentially harmful projects. This decision highlights the Ontario

government's clear intentions to prioritize reckless development absent of evidence and at potentially great cost to the public.

### Mining Act (Schedule 5)

Schedule 5 proposes to amend the *Mining Act* by removing the public's ability to track mining claims. That is, ministerial powers are being expanded by giving the Minister the power to suspend some or all functioning of the Mining Lands Administration System (MLAS) - the online system used for administering and registering mining claims on traditional Indigenous lands (or public lands).

Amendments to the Mining Act will also provide the Minister with the discretionary power to establish a team of public servants to fast-track mining permits for individual proponents. It is unclear if this concierge service would be available to both established, well-connected mining companies and junior miners.

What are the implications?

 The new Ministerial powers are being proposed without information on basic, minimum standards for ensuring transparency and procedural fairness. Further, the focus on expediting permitting through a concierge service (again without criteria, standards or transparency) will likely lead to inefficient resource allocation and preferential treatment provided to well-connected firms.

### **Council Report**

# SUBJECT: ENFORCEMENT AT TOWNSHIP OF THE NORTH SHORE BOAT LAUNCHES

**RECOMMENDATION:** That Council receive the report from staff regarding the gazebo and deferred enforcement at the Cookhouse Boat Launch in Algoma Mills for information purposes, and that Council direct Staff to follow and Enforce Policies L-3 and P-6 and By-Law 15-32 for all boat launches in the Township of The North Shore, effective immediately.

At the August 14<sup>th</sup>, 2024, and September 18<sup>th</sup>, 2024, Regular Council meetings, Council Deferred the recommendations from staff in the form of motions where direction was requested for Township of The North Shore policies and by-laws related to parking, local business support, and dockage be enforced at all boat launching areas.

At the April 29th, 2025, Special Council meeting, Council passed the following Resolution to move the gazebo project originally proposed for the Cookhouse Boat Launch in Algoma Mills to the "mountain" at the Pater Boat Launch located in Spragge:

"RESOLUTION #25-106 Moved by: T. Simon Seconded by: R. Green

BE IT RESOLVED that Council for the Corporation of the Township of The North Shore direct staff to move forward with the gazebo project that was approved in the 2024 Capital Budget, and direct staff to move the placement of the gazebo to Pater Boat Launch in Spragge.

CARRIED"

As the Gazebo project has now been moved to the Pater Boat Launch "mountain", staff are requesting that Council enforce the following at all boat launching areas within the Township of The North Shore:

- Policy L-3, Local Business Support
- Policy P-6, Parking/Storage on Municipal Property
- By-Law 15-32 being a by-law to repeal and replace by-law 15-26 being a by-law to regulate the use of public docks and launching ramps.

Consistent enforcement of parking rules at all boat launch areas in the Township of The North Shore demonstrates fairness, equity and reduces the perception of received special treatment, ensures that our Emergency Services are able to access boat launches in a safe and effective manner, and helps protect the surrounding environment by preventing vehicles from parking in sensitive areas.

Dear Head of Council,

On May 12, 2025 I introduced the *Protect Ontario by Building Faster and Smarter Act,* 2025 (Bill 17). Through this legislation, and other changes, we are responding to recommendations and requests from municipal leaders to make it easier and faster to build new homes and infrastructure Ontario needs like transit, roads, water, and wastewater systems.

The bill contains bold actions to protect Ontario from the Ministry of Municipal Affairs and Housing, the Ministry of Infrastructure and the Ministry of Transportation. Details about the range of measures can be found in the <a href="news-release">news-release</a>.

#### **Building Code Act – Ministry of Municipal Affairs and Housing**

Schedule 1 of the Bill proposes changes to the Building Code Act which include:

- Adding a provision to clarify that municipalities do not have the authority to create or enforce their own construction standards.
- Eliminating the requirement for a secondary provincial approval of innovative construction products for products that have already undergone a "Canadian Code Compliance Evaluation" by the federal Canadian Construction Materials Centre (25-MMAH0042). Comments can be made through the Regulatory Registry of Ontario (RR) from May 12, 2025, to June 11, 2025.

#### Development Charges Act – Ministry of Municipal Affairs and Housing

Schedule 4 of the Bill proposes changes to the *Development Charges Act, 1997*, to standardize the development charge (DC) methodology and framework and improve predictability of costs, include:

- Creating a regulation-making authority to merge service categories for DC credits.
- Creating a regulation-making authority to specify what constitutes a "local service."
- Expanding the DC deferral to non-rental residential developments. Related changes include:

- Providing municipalities authority, in circumstances set out in regulation, to require financial security for payment of deferred DCs for non-rental residential developments; and
- Removing authority for municipalities to charge interest on any legislated DC deferral amounts.
- Enabling municipalities to make any changes to their DC by-laws for the sole purpose of reducing DCs or removing indexing without undertaking certain procedural requirements.
- Creating a regulation-making authority to prescribe exceptions, including conditional exceptions, to capital costs that are eligible to be recovered from DCs.
- Providing that the frozen DC rates on a development would not be applicable if the current DC rates in effect would result in a lower payment.
- Exempting long-term care homes within the meaning of subsection 2 (1) of the *Fixing Long-Term Care Act, 2021* from municipal DCs.

We are interested in receiving your comments on these proposed measures. Comments can be made through the Regulatory Registry of Ontario (RR) from May 12, 2025, to June 11, 2025:

• RR 25-MMAH003: Changes to the *Development Charges Act, 1997,* to Simplify and Standardize the Development Charge (DC) Framework.

#### Planning Act – Ministry of Municipal Affairs and Housing

Schedules 3 and 7 of the Bill propose changes to the *Planning Act* and the *City of Toronto Act*, 2006 that would help streamline and standardize municipal development processes. If passed, the proposed changes would:

- Provide authority for regulations to limit municipal complete application studies and provide greater recognition of planning reports prepared by prescribed certified professionals,
- Remove the need for certain minor variances,
- Give the Minister of Municipal Affairs and Housing the authority to impose conditions on a use permitted by a Minister's zoning order, and
- Streamline planning approvals for publicly funded kindergarten to grade 12 schools.

We are interested in receiving your comments on these proposed measures. Comments can be made through the Environmental Registry of Ontario from May 12, 2025, to June 11, 2025:

• <u>ERO 025-0461</u>: Proposed Planning Act and City of Toronto Act, 2006 Changes (Schedules 3 and 7 of Bill 17- Protect Ontario by Building Faster and Smarter Act, 2025).

We are also interested in receiving any comments you may have on associated regulatory changes. The government is undertaking 45-day consultations on the following proposals from May 12, 2025, to June 26, 2025:

- <u>ERO 025-0462</u>: Proposed Regulations Complete Application (seeking feedback on proposed regulations to address complete application requirements (study/report requirements) and submissions from certified professionals)
- <u>ERO 025-0463</u>: Proposed Regulation As-of-right Variations from Setback Requirements (seeking feedback on a proposed regulation that would allow variations to be permitted "as-of-right" if a proposal is within 10% of requirements for setbacks from property lines applicable to specified lands)

The Environmental Registry postings provide additional details regarding the proposed changes.

#### Ministry of Infrastructure Act – Ministry of Infrastructure

Schedule 6 of the Bill proposes changes to the *Ministry of Infrastructure Act, 2011* (MOIA), to provide the Minister of Infrastructure with the authority to request information and data from municipalities and municipal agencies, where needed to support provincially funded infrastructure projects. This would help speed up the delivery of critical infrastructure that our growing communities need, while also supporting jobs and economic growth. Comments can be made through the Regulatory Registry of Ontario (RR-25MOI003) from May 12, 2025, to June 11, 2025.

#### Transit-Oriented Communities Act – Ministry of Infrastructure

Proposed changes to the *Transit-Oriented Communities (TOC) Act*, 2020, would reduce barriers to implementing the Transit Oriented Communities (TOC) by:

- Amending the definition of a "Transit Oriented Communities project" to include projects along the GO and LRT network more efficiently,
- Removing OIC approval requirements for any agreements between the Minister\_(or an entity with delegated powers) and a municipality, and
- Enabling the Minister to delegate certain responsibilities to Infrastructure Ontario for the purpose of developing TOCs.

We are interested in receiving your comments on these proposed changes. Comments can be made through the Environmental Registry of Ontario from May 12, 2025, to June 11, 2025:

• <u>ERO 025-0504</u>: Proposed *Transit-Oriented Communities Act, 2020*, changes to reduce barriers to implementing municipal agreements.

#### **Ministry of Transportation**

Schedule 2 of the bill proposes a change to the *Building Transit Faster Act, 2020* (BTFA) that, if passed, would extend the use of the BTFA measures to all provincial transit projects. This change would remove barriers to building transit faster and get shovels in the ground quicker to build major provincial transit projects that connect communities.

A proposed amendment to the *Metrolinx Act*, *2006*, permits the Minister of Transportation to request certain information and data from municipalities or municipal agencies necessary to support the development of provincial transit projects or Transit-Oriented Communities projects.

You may provide your comments on the proposed change to the BTFA through the Environmental Registry of Ontario (ERO) notice <u>ERO 025-0450</u> and the Ontario Regulatory Registry notice (<u>RR 25-MTO005</u>) and the Metrolinx Act (<u>RR 25-MTO006</u>) from May 12, 2025 to June 11, 2025.

The government invites you to review the <u>Environmental Registry of Ontario</u> and <u>Regulatory Registry of Ontario</u> posting links provided above and share any feedback you may have. In the face of economic uncertainty, we must protect Ontario by speeding up construction so we can lower housing costs and keep workers on the job. AND WHEREAS Section 5(4) subsections (1) to (3) of the Municipal Act S.O. 2001, c.25, as amended, apply to all municipal powers, whether conferred by this Act or otherwise;

AND WHEREAS the Council of the Corporation of the Township of the North Shore deems it appropriate to adopt a Scent Free Workplace Policy;

NOW THEREFORE THE COUNCIL OF THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWNSHIP OF THE NORTH SHORE HEREBY ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. That the Scent Free Workplace Policy hereto as Schedule "A" be adopted.
- 2. That Schedule "A" be declared to form part of this by-law.
- 3. This By-Law shall come into force and take effect on the date of passing thereof and its short title is "Scent Free Workplace Policy By-Law"

#### 1.0 Purpose and Scope

- 1.1 The Township of The North Shore acknowledges its responsibility in providing a healthy environment for staff, Municipal Council, Committee members and the public. The Township is a scent-free environment and wishes to limit the exposure of staff, Municipal Council, Committee members and the public to chemical substances and asks that all staff, Members of Municipal Council, and Committee members refrain from using, wearing, and bringing scented products and materials into the Township's properties and buildings at any time, as they may cause adverse physical effects that threaten the ongoing health and safety of our staff, Members of Council, Committee members, visitors, and the public at large.
- **1.2** The Township asks for everyone's cooperation in our efforts to accommodate current or potential health concerns of our employees, Members of Council, Committee members, and members of the public, and minimize unnecessary workplace health and safety hazards.

#### 2.0 Definitions

- **2.1** Scents the smells or odours from colognes and aftershaves, fragrances and perfumes, body sprays, lotions and creams, shampoo and hair conditioners, hairsprays, deodorants, incense, potpourri, industrial and household chemicals, soaps, cosmetics, air fresheners and deodorizers, oils including essential oils and roll-ons, candles, scented garbage bags, building materials, upholstery fabrics, carpeting, combustion exhausts, dry-cleaning residue, newsprint and inked papers, recreational cannabis products that may give off a strong scent including unburnt dried cannabis, oils, pipes, and other paraphernalia.
- **2.2** Fragrance-free/Scent-free means that there have been no fragrances added to the cosmetic product, or that a masking agent has been added in order to hide the scents from the other ingredients in the product.

#### 3.0 Background

**3.1** Fragrances and scented products are everywhere in our society. As many scented products contain respiratory irritants, they may trigger sensitivities or aggravate asthma and allergies in certain individuals. Symptoms such as headaches, dizziness, nausea, fatigue, weakness, insomnia, malaise, loss of appetite, depression, upper respiratory symptoms, shortness of breath, difficulty with concentration and skin irritation have also been reported to result from exposure to scented products. Many of these symptoms are reported to worsen when people spend much of their time working indoors. The severity of the symptoms can vary by person but should all be taken seriously.

#### 4.0 Policy

- **4.1** Township staff, Municipal Council, and Committee members shall set the standard by not wearing overly scented personal care products while attending Municipally owned offices, public buildings, or properties.
- **4.2** Township staff are expected to communicate this policy to visitors and the public through signs posted at the entrances of buildings, and provide explanation to other staff, Municipal Council, Committee members, or the public who are using scented products or bringing in scented products to the workplace.
- **4.3** Anyone that may be identified as a source of a scent, will be requested to refrain from the use of specific scented products and/or asked to substitute a personal care product with a scent-free product. The individual identified as the source of the scent may be sent home (with or without pay depending on the circumstance) to remove the scent prior to re-entering the Municipally owned offices, public buildings, and properties.
- **4.4** The Township of The North Shore will maintain, as reasonably practicable, scent free buildings and work environments and eliminate the use of products where scent or other properties are known to cause health problems.
- **4.5** Staff with concerns about scents or other odours associated with products used while performing job duties should contact the immediate supervisor or manager to determine if there is an appropriate product substitution available.
- **4.6** Staff with concerns about potential symptoms caused by exposure to fragrances should refer themselves to an appropriate health care practitioner.
- **4.7** Information regarding this policy will be added to the Township's website and provided to all new employees, Members of Municipal Council, and Committee members.
- **4.8** Managers are responsible for ensuring employees comply with this policy. Continued non-compliance of the policy by employees may result in progressive discipline. Continued non-compliance of the policy by Members of Council or Committee members may result in the Member of Council or the Committee being asked to refrain from attending the Municipal offices, public buildings, or properties and will need to attend Council or Committee meetings electronically until the policy can be followed successfully.

#### 5.0 Exceptions to Scent-free Restrictions

- **5.1** Under certain circumstances, the Township of The North Shore may need to make exceptions to this policy in order to effectively maintain or repair work sites and/or buildings, (e.g., painting, varnishing, floor stripping, roofing etc.). In these cases, every attempt will be made to utilize low odour paints and other materials.
- **5.2** To maintain a scent-free environment, any staff who are responsible for purchasing and receiving products must ensure, to the best of their ability, that the product does not emit strong vapours or odours that may affect scent sensitivities. This may be done through evaluation of the Safety Data Sheets (SDSs) or product prior to purchasing.

#### **BY-LAW 25-21**

#### THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWNSHIP OF THE NORTH SHORE

Being a by-law to levy and collect property taxes for the year 2025

WHEREAS the Council of the Corporation of the Township of the North Shore has by By-Law 25-XX of the Township dated the 21<sup>st</sup> day of May, 2025 prepared and adopted estimates of all sums required during the year for the purposes of the Municipality totaling \$1,203,530 pursuant to Section 290 of the Municipal Act, 2001, S.O. 2001 c.25, as amended (hereinafter referred to as the "Municipal Act");

AND WHEREAS the total of sums required by taxation in the year 2025 shall be apportioned as follows, in accordance with Section 312 of the *Municipal Act*:

1. \$1,203,530 by the Municipality's General Local Levy.

AND WHEREAS all property assessment rolls on which the 2025 taxes are to be levied have been returned and revised pursuant to the provisions of the Assessment Act, R.S.O. 1990, c. A31, as amended (hereinafter referred to as the "Assessment Act");

AND WHEREAS Property Classes and Property Subclasses have been prescribed pursuant to Section 7 and 8 of the *Assessment Act*:

AND WHEREAS the Municipality is required to establish tax ratios pursuant to Section 308 of the *Municipal Act* for each prescribed Property Class;

AND WHEREAS the Municipality is required to establish tax rate reductions pursuant to Section 313 of the *Municipal Act* for each prescribed Property Subclass;

AND WHEREAS Section 312 of the *Municipal Act* provides for the establishment of tax rates to be levied for local municipal purposes;

AND WHEREAS the taxes for School purposes shall be levied, collected and administered by the Municipality in accordance with the Education Act, R.S.O. 1990, c.E.2, Ontario Regulation 400/98 made and most recently revised under that Act;

**AND WHEREAS Part** X of the *Municipal Act* provides for the issuance of tax bills and the collection and administration of tax amounts;

**NOW THEREFORE**, the Council of The Corporation of the Township of the North Shore **ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:** 

In this by-law the following words shall be defined as:

"Collector" shall mean Township Treasurer, Deputy Treasurer, Tax Collector, Deputy Tax Collector or person designated by the Treasurer;

- 1. THAT for the taxation year 2024, the tax ratio for property in:
  - a) the residential property class is 1.000000;
  - b) the multi-residential property class is 1.100000;
  - c) the commercial property class is 1.100000;
  - d) the industrial property class is 1.100000;
  - e) the aggregate extractive property class is 1.100000;
  - f) the farm property class is 0.250000; and
  - g) the managed forest property class is 0.250000.
- 2. THAT for the taxation year 2025 the Township shall levy on rateable property the Tax Rates set out in Schedule "A" attached hereto and forming part of this by-law in accordance with the following:
  - a) General Municipal Tax Rates shall be levied on **all** property rateable for Municipal purposes.
- 3. THAT the final tax levy to be billed under this by-law shall be reduced by the amount raised by the interim tax levy.
- 4. THAT the final tax levy to be billed and imposed under this by-law shall be paid in two installments due on the following dates:
  - a) 50% thereof on the 27<sup>th</sup> day of August 2025; and
  - b) The remainder thereof on the 29<sup>th</sup> day of October 2025.
- 5. THAT all taxes levied under this by-law shall be payable into the hands of the Collector in accordance with the provisions of this by-law.

- 6. THAT there shall be imposed on all taxes a penalty for non-payment or late payment of taxes in default on the installment dates set out above in accordance with Section 345(2) of the *Municipal Act*, 2001. The penalty shall be one and one-quarter percent (1.25%) of the amount in default on the first day of default being the day immediately after the due dates referred to above.
- THAT there shall be levied an interest charge pursuant to Section 345(3) of the *Municipal Act* of one and one quarter percent (1.25%) calculated on the first day of the next calendar month after default or non-payment of each installment levied pursuant to this by-law and a further one and one quarter percent (1.25%) shall be levied on the unpaid installment on the first day of each calendar month thereafter for so long as the installment remains unpaid.
- 8. THAT the Collector may mail or cause to be mailed to the address of the residence or place of business of each person taxed under this by-law, a notice specifying the amount of taxes payable.
- THAT the notice to be mailed under this by-law shall contain the particulars provided for in this by-law and the information required to be entered on the tax bill under Section 343 of the Municipal Act.
- 10. THAT the Collector shall be authorized to accept part payment from time to time on account of any taxes due, and to give a receipt of such part payment, provided that acceptance of any such part payment shall not affect the collection of any percentage charge imposed and collectable under this by-law in respect of non-payment or late payment of any taxes or any installment of taxes.
- 11. THAT nothing in this by-law shall prevent the Collector from proceeding at any time with the collection of any tax, or any part thereof, in accordance with the provisions of the statutes and by-laws governing the collection of taxes.
- 12. THAT the Township Treasurer is hereby directed and authorized to undertake any required action necessary to collect the taxes levied herein;

13. THAT this by-law comes into force on the day it is passe	ed.

#### THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWNSHIP OF THE NORTH SHORE

# BEING A BY-LAW TO ADOPT THE ESTIMATES FOR ALL THE SUMS REQUIRED DURING THE YEAR 2025 FOR THE PURPOSES OF THE TOWNSHIP OF THE NORTH SHORE.

#### SHORT FORM OF THIS BY-LAW: BUDGET BY-LAW 2025

WHEREAS pursuant to the Municipal Act, 2001, as amended, section 290, the Council of a local municipality shall in each year prepare and adopt a budget including estimates of all sums required during the year for the purposes of the Municipality;

**AND WHEREAS** the proposed revenues and expenses have been reviewed;

**NOW THEREFORE** the Council of the Township of the North Shore enacts as follows:

- 2. THAT any By-law or By-laws, or parts of any By-law or By-laws that are inconsistent with this By-law are hereby deemed repealed.

#### **BY-LAW 25-23**

#### THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWNSHIP OF THE NORTH SHORE

## Being a bylaw to confirm the proceedings of Council at its Regular Council Meeting of May 21st, 2025.
