



Property Taxes Due

A friendly reminder that the 2nd property tax installment for your 2021 **final** property tax bill is due on Friday, **October 29**th, **2021**.

The 2022 interim property tax bills are scheduled to be issued by the end of February, 2022.

Penalty and Interest for Late Payment

Please be advised that a penalty of 1.25% will get applied to your property tax account if your payment is not received in full by the Township by the installment due date. An interest charge of 1.25% will also be applied to your property tax account on the 1^{st} of every month thereafter for as long as the installment remains unpaid

Tax Arrears Notice

If you have property taxes that are **past due**, please note that the full balance is now due along with all late payment charges.

Please note that properties that are two (2) or more years in property tax arrears are eligible to be registered for tax sale. In order to avoid incurring collection costs and in order to avoid jeopardizing the ownership of your property, it is highly recommended that you pay your property tax arrears in full.

Property Tax Bills

Please contact the Municipal Office if:

- you have not received a tax bill;
 - your mailing address has changed;
 - you would like your account balance;
 - you have received a tax bill, but no longer own the property;
 - you would like to inquire about payment options;
 - you have received a reminder notice for an account you thought was paid.

Supplementary/Omitted Tax Billings

The Township issues supplementary/omitted tax bills for the following reasons:

- a change to your property, such as an addition, new construction or renovation;
- MPAC assessed a structure on your property for the first time;
- there was a change to your property's classification.

Property tax dollars associated with any changes are retroactive to the "effective date" provided by MPAC, which may be the date of occupancy or the date when the renovation or alterations were completed. The Township can assist in setting you up with a payment plan to help minimize the impact.

HAPPY HALLOWEEN 2021

Federal health officials have ok'd participating in Halloween events this year, but it's important to stay vigilant about COVID-19 safety.

Federal health officials have deemed trick-or-treating and participating in Halloween events low-risk this year, but it's still important to exercise caution and stay vigilant about safety

With Halloween just weeks away, health officials are offering COVID-19 guidance for how to celebrate safely.

Medical officer of health Dr. Hsiu-Li Wang said anyone heading out to trick-or-treat on Halloween should follow public health protocols.

FOR TRICK-OR-TREATERS:

- Stay home if sick
- Follow an outdoor route
- Wait for others to leave a home before approaching
- Wear a face covering

Dr. Wang said a costume mask is not a suitable replacement for a face covering. She also recommends trick-or-treaters avoid wearing both a costume mask and a face covering.

IF GIVING OUT CANDY:

- Wash hands before giving out candy
- Only hand out purchased and packaged treats
- Wear a face mask
- Don't ask trick-or-treaters to shout or sing

For those planning to host a Halloween party, Dr. Wang said gathering limits must be followed. Indoor gatherings are currently capped at 25 people and outdoor gatherings are restricted to 100 people.
