Your municipality played an important role in facilitating census collection encouraging your employees and the public they serve to participate in this national exercise. Participation across the country was simply outstanding. Thanks to your steadfast support, we achieved an <u>overall collection response rate</u> of 98.0% and an online response rate of 84.1%. What is included in a WETT inspection?

A WETT inspection includes:

- A detailed look at the chimney
- An evaluation of the liner and flue
- Smoke chamber check
- Inspection of the damper
- A close appraisal of the firebox
- A superficial and structural look at the hearth or floor around the appliance
- A general inspection of the surrounding area



- Always use a fire screen around the fireplace!








